

### **A DREAM COME TRUE**

*(Editor's note: this was published in PLA's Spring 1991 newsletter. )*

A couple years ago (1989), in a hunting camp in Northeastern Pennsylvania, three hunting pals were swapping tales and passing time. Jim Sherwood, a longbow enthusiast, Tome Cole, an Old Time Bowyer, and Brian Hartford, a recently converted traditionalist dreamed of having a longbow shoot in Pennsylvania. From this conversation, plans were made to have a Traditional Shoot in August 1990.

Flyers were printed announcing the shoot, to be held at Denton Hill Ski Resort in Potter County. These were handed out by Tom Cole and Jim Sherwood at the Allentown Sportsman's Show in March 1990. The Response was overwhelming, causing Jim and Tom to realize that Pennsylvania's traditional archers were ready to organize.

Eighteen Longbow enthusiasts met in March 1990, and the Pennsylvania Longbow Association was formally chartered. The purpose was to provide an association for those "who wish to restore the challenge and romance associated with

archery in its more primitive forms.".. Jim Billings was elected President, Jim Sherwood was elected Vice-president, Brian Hartford was elected Membership Secretary, and Tom Cole was elected Secretary/Chaplain. Within a couple of months, membership doubled as interest in the organization grew.

The Pennsylvania Longbow Association and its members do not wish to disassociate themselves from contemporary archery. Their intent is to gather together people who take the longbow seriously, on the range as well as in the hunting field. Those joining the Pennsylvania Longbow Association are expected to acquaint themselves with, and shoot the longbow, using traditional shooting style. While the focus of the organization is primarily on the longbow, all traditional shooters are welcomed.

The major event of the year was the Eastern Traditional Archery Rendezvous held at Denton Hill on August 3-5. This event encompassed all types of traditional archery including longbows, recurves, Indian bows and even the traditional English self wood longbow. The organizers were pleasantly surprised when 487 registered shooters and scores of observers showed up for this very first Traditional Rendezvous.

The shoot was originally set up for competition, but it was soon realized that this was a “FUN” shoot. There were three courses with different levels of difficulty. There was “*Suicide Hill*”, “*Cardiac Ridge*”, and “*Dinosaur Hollow*” (for the more intelligent, mature archer). There was even a children’s range with dinosaur targets.

Many dealers attended including Bob Huchinson (Taper King), Bill Shults (Renaissance Archery), Bruce Green (Green Traditional Archery Supplies) and Jim Sherwood (Sherwood Traditional Archery).

Well know bowyers were also in attendance. Jerry Brum, of Great Northern Archery, Rick Ingram, maker of Woodland Bows, Gary Munro from Canada, and The Old timer – Tom Cole displayed their products.

Several clinics were put on and the event was topped off with a Bonfire Get Together on Saturday evening. Bear Paw provided the tall tales, making it an extremely successful night. The Rendezvous concluded with Church Services on Sunday morning , preached by Tom Cole.
